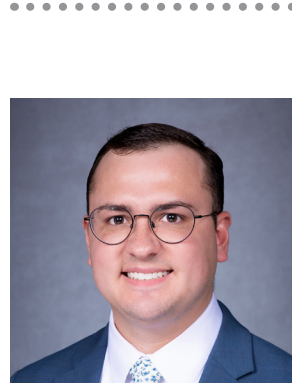

**Education:** Doctor of Pharmacy – University of Illinois at Chicago College of Pharmacy

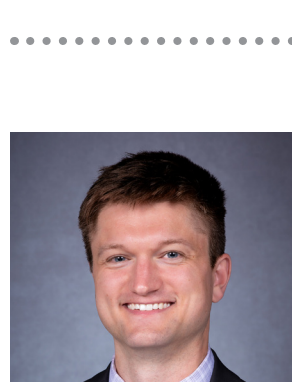
